#### Why a "common European sign"?

RFID Recommendation of May 2009 – makes several references to the need for a "common European sign":

- 1. For use by operators to inform of the presence of RFID readers,
  - A. Identity of the operator, &
  - B. A point of contact for individuals to obtain the information policy for the application
- 2. For use by operators who embed or apply RFID tags to retail products

### Why a common European sign now?

- Matching with widening applications many of which are increasing RFID presence in the public domain
- Key Objectives:
  - Notification of "presence"
    - Removing the silent and invisible
    - Raising awareness
  - Commonality consistency of the look and use:
    - Across Member States
    - In different RFID applications
    - Being valid for a broad section of RFID technologies

#### Stakeholder Participation Focused

- RFID Recommendation developed and agreed by the EC RFID Formal Expert Group
- Implementation supported by EC RFID Recommendation Informal Working Group
- RFID in Europe Work Package 5:
  - Stakeholder meeting to present candidate signs & contributory studies
  - Issued stakeholder report March 2010
  - Developing position paper on common European sign use 05/2011
  - Opportunities for European Consumer Study TBC
- RFID Mandate European Standards Organizations
  - With stakeholder involvement defined detailed requirements
  - Evaluated existing signs identified by RFID in Europe WP5
  - Recommended "way-forward" for New sign standard & Emblem
  - To develop common European sign standard 2012

### What will be the common European sign?

- Stakeholder broad agreement that it <u>cannot</u> be a commercial logo, nor a trade mark, nor a privacy mark, etc.
- When notifying presence of <u>RFID readers</u> the sign must include operator identity and point of contact
- When notifying the presence of <u>RFID tag embeded or attached within retail products</u> the **sign** may be used but an **emblem** will suffice. Stakeholders have agreed that the optional use of the ISO/IEC 29160 Line option 52. RFID Special Case

#### Voluntary Guidelines for Use?

- To provide all operators that have not been involved with the RFID Recommendation to benefit from the experience of stakeholders who have
- Assisting operator moves to comply with policy through appropriate actions supporting:
  - Consistency required to achieve "commonality"
  - Fast and efficient compliance through greater clarity
- Ultimately enabling the public to be notified and through notification offering them an opportunity to be better informed too!
